What is the difference between Ampere and Coulomb?

The ampere is a measure of the amount of electric charge in motion per unit time - that is, electric current. But the quantity of electric charge by itself, whether in motion or not, is expressed by another SI unit, the coulomb (C). One coulomb is equal to about  $6.241 \times 10^{18}$  electric charges (e).
